TWINNING WITH HENSTEDT-ULZBURG

Following the YES vote at the AGM to move forward to a formal German twinning much has happened. A party of German teachers will be visiting Crookhorn School from 22nd May to observe their teaching methods. On 28th May a small group of our members will be flying to Germany to sign the formal twinning charter. Following that they will accompany people from Henstedt-Ulzburg on a visit to Usedom (H-U's former East German twin town) where they will be joined by a party from Maurepas for the Europe Day celebrations. It is hoped that a party form H-U may visit us later in the year for a second signing of the charter in this country.
